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### **Certificate Description**

Public Health has grown to encompass many disciplines and to focus on disease prevention in communities and across healthcare settings. The Graduate Certificate in Public Health Administration provides foundational skills and knowledge in working with local communities, government agencies and community-based non-profit agencies to develop health initiatives and evaluate their outcomes.

#### **Admission Requirments**

Applicants are required to have an undergraduate grade-point average of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Applicants with a cumulative undergraduate grade point average of 2.99-2.75 will be required to submit an official report of the Graduate Record Examination (General Test) scores for admission consideration.
