6994. Research Methods for Nonthesis. A course focused on reviewing current biological concepts as reported in the scientific literature. Not applicable for students enrolled in the thesis or biology education options. Prereq.: Permission of instructor. 2 s.h.

This is an independent study course that is only for Non-Thesis graduate students. The course is taken once for a total of 2 s.h. The course requires the writing of a substantial Research/Literature Review paper, approval of the final Review by the student's primary Faculty Advisor, and an oral presentation of this paper to Division of Biological Sciences as a Seminar.
