### Course Description

This course builds upon students' knowledge of the writing process and rhetorical concepts as they conduct scholarly inquiry on a specific topic using academic research. The course emphasizes the process of investigation including identifying problems to explore with research, collecting data from primary and/or secondary sources, synthesizing source material, and clearly presenting the results of these inquiries in a research-based argument. Students write a minimum of 5,000 words (approximately 20 double-spaced pages) cumulatively across the major assignments. Grading is ABCDF. English 1551 is three semester hours. Prereq.: ENGL 1549 with a grade of "C" or better or ENGL 1550 with a grade of "C" or better or ACT/SAT scores or Composition Placement Test results. 3 s.h.

### Course Overview

Writing 2 will help you develop critical thinking and writing skills as you learn to synthesize your perspectives with those of other writers. Focusing on strategies, tools, and resources for research writing, this course expands the process approach from Writing 1 and helps students further develop their skills in brainstorming, drafting, feedback, revising, and editing. You will differentiate between scholarly and popular sources and integrate scholarly, academic texts with your own arguments. The goal is to prepare you for writing and communicative tasks in the university, in the workplace, and in your civic, social, and professional life.
